### From the Desk of Father Bill



#### A Season for Thanksgiving

As we near the end of the year, we enter a season with a special emphasis on thanksgiving. Of course, every day we live is reason enough for thanksgiving, but the calendar, and especially retail merchants, remind us that there is an official day for Thanksgiving – the fourth Thursday of November as proclaimed by President Abraham Lincoln in 1863 during the dark days of the Civil War when it was hard to find much for which to be thankful.

Most of us have grown up with a romanticized vision of that first Thanksgiving feast purportedly held in 1621 in Plymouth, Massachusetts – Pilgrims with black, broad-brimmed hats and their family members, sitting around a large table with a few indigenous people (Indians), eating turkey and all the trimmings. But most historians agree that the Thanksgiving meal in Plymouth probably had little in common with today's traditional holiday spread.

More than likely, instead of turkey as the main entrée, the Wampanoag people brought venison along with lots of local seafood (mussels, lobster, bass) plus the fruits of the first pilgrim harvest, including pumpkin, which the Wampanoag taught them how to grow. It is also highly probable that the pilgrims were invited guests of the Wampanoag at their feast and not vice versa as we have been led to believe.

# **Discernment Committee Update**

The St. John in the Wilderness Discernment Committee is nearing the end of its nearly yearlong task of identifying candidates for our rector position and making recommendations to the Vestry.

We were privileged to have a strong group of finalists, and the committee spent September and October conducting in-person visits and interviews with these priests. Afterwards, the committee spent considerable time in meetings to evaluate which of the candidates are deserving of consideration by the Vestry. These findings will be presented to the Vestry at the end of October.

At that point the Vestry will take responsibility for the final steps of the discernment process, which will be to invite each of the finalists to Flat Rock for an interview, a tour of the church and local community, and a meeting with the Bishop. Depending on the availability of all parties involved, hopefully this will conclude by the end of November. However, given the difficulty of arranging meetings around the Thanksgiving holiday, it could run into early December. Afterwards, the Vestry will have the responsibility of choosing a priest from among the final candidates and issuing the "rector call."

As always, thank you for your ongoing support as we collectively discern the future of St. John in the Wilderness.

# The Baring Society




This summer, the Vestry approved the establishment of a legacy organization to recognize those who have included St. John in the Wilderness in their estate planning. It was given the name of the Baring Society to honor Charles and Susan Baring, who in 1836 donated their family chapel to the Episcopal Diocese of North Carolina. It is their legacy which is now ours to perpetuate.

Over 75 people have joined in this commitment to our future, and they were recognized at a special event hosted by Debby Staton at her historic home. Named Brookland when built by Charles Edmondston in 1836, Charles and Susan Baring were guests at Brookland on many occasions. A Baring Society plaque was unveiled during the event, and others are encouraged to join by making this same commitment in their estate planning. The plaque now hangs in the entry hall of the administration building
