# From the Desk of Father Bill HAPPY BIRTHDAY!

June 9 is the Feast of Pentecost, or as the English call it, "Whitsunday," which is considered the birthday of the Church. The 50 days of Eastertide have ended, and we begin the longest season of the liturgical year – the Season of Pentecost, which extends for six months until Advent, the first Sunday of December, and the beginning of a new liturgical year. Pentecost celebrates the gift of the Holy Spirit as Jesus promised. Following Jesus' return to the Father (Ascension), the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity, descends like a dove and empowers the disciples to carry on Jesus' ministry. The church becomes the Body of Christ – his hands and feet in the world. The story of Pentecost is recorded in the book of the Acts of the Apostles, or Luke/Acts, because scholars believe it was written by Luke the Evangelist to whom the Gospel according to Luke is attributed.

As members of the Body of Christ, following in the original disciples' footsteps, we spend our time during the Season of Pentecost learning what it means to be a true disciple of the risen Christ. In the Sunday Adult Forum during June we will be learning about stewardship as a lifestyle. Various presenters will share

with us how to be good stewards of our time and talent in serving others through "inreach" to our parish and "outreach" in the community, nation and world. Children and youth will participate in Creation Care Camp where they will learn about being good stewards of our environment, God's creation. Then in July and August we will turn our attention to The Way of Love, seven spiritual practices of a Jesus-centered life. In the fall our focus will be on stewardship of treasure as we consider how to use our financial resources to support the work of building God's kingdom through mission and ministry.

It is an exciting time in our parish! The Discernment Committee is hard at work preparing the profile for a new rector. Our various committees and organizations continue their vital ministries and are always looking for new members to join them. And of course, the summer months allow us time for refreshment and renewal with family and friends.

**Book Sale Benefiting ECW.** Be sure and visit Books for Good (BFG) during its spring sale set for June 3-8. All books, CDs, and DVDs will be 25 percent off. Select from more than 50,000 adult and children's books (most used, some new).

By September 1955 she stood atop Maine's Mount Katahdin, sang "America, the Beautiful," and proclaimed, "I said I'll do it, and I've done it."


